

Our mission is to provide safe living options and services for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning (LGBTQ) youth, and allies who are at risk of or experiencing homelessness.

- An estimated 30-40% of all youth experiencing homelessness in the U.S. are LGBTQ. A
 local Albuquerque survey of more than 100 homeless youth found that nearly half selfidentify as "gender queer."
- Allies are people who do not identify as LGBTQ, but support those who do, fighting together to end the injustices that occur.
- Casa Q has served more than 30 LGBTQ youth ages 14-18 in the three years since opening February 2015.
- Our 8-bedroom house is licensed by the state's Children, Youth and Families Department (CYFD) as a Multi-Service Home. We can serve up to 10 residents at a time.




- The Casa Q operating budget covers all costs for the facility as well as 24/7 staffing who work one-on-one with youth to help them achieve their goals.
- Our licensing allows both long- and short-term stays which gives us flexibility to respond to all needs, not just emergency shelter.
- We also work to help community partners become more culturally competent with LGBTQ youth.
- In future years, the Casa Q team hopes to recruit and train mentors and foster families to support LGBTQ youth.
